2015 Orlando Japan Festival



On November 11, 2015, the Orlando Japan Festival took place at the Village at Hunter's Creek in Orlando, Florida. This year marked the 15th anniversary of the festival organized by the Japan Association of Orlando. The Consulate General of Japan in Miami has also been a proud supporter since 2002.

Beyond the stage, a number of booths shared cultural information and Japanese-inspired services, including Japanese tea, Yukata try-ons, and traditional festival games. With the assistance of the Orlando Hoshuko (supplementary Japanese school), the Consulate General of Japan held an origami corner where student volunteers showed visitors of the festival how to fold origami cranes. Reporters from the Orlando Sentinel, a local media outlet, visited our booth and interviewed Consul General Okaniwa. The footage was released the same night.

In a wonderful turnout, thousands of people attended and enjoyed the festival until the very end, despite the blistering heat.
