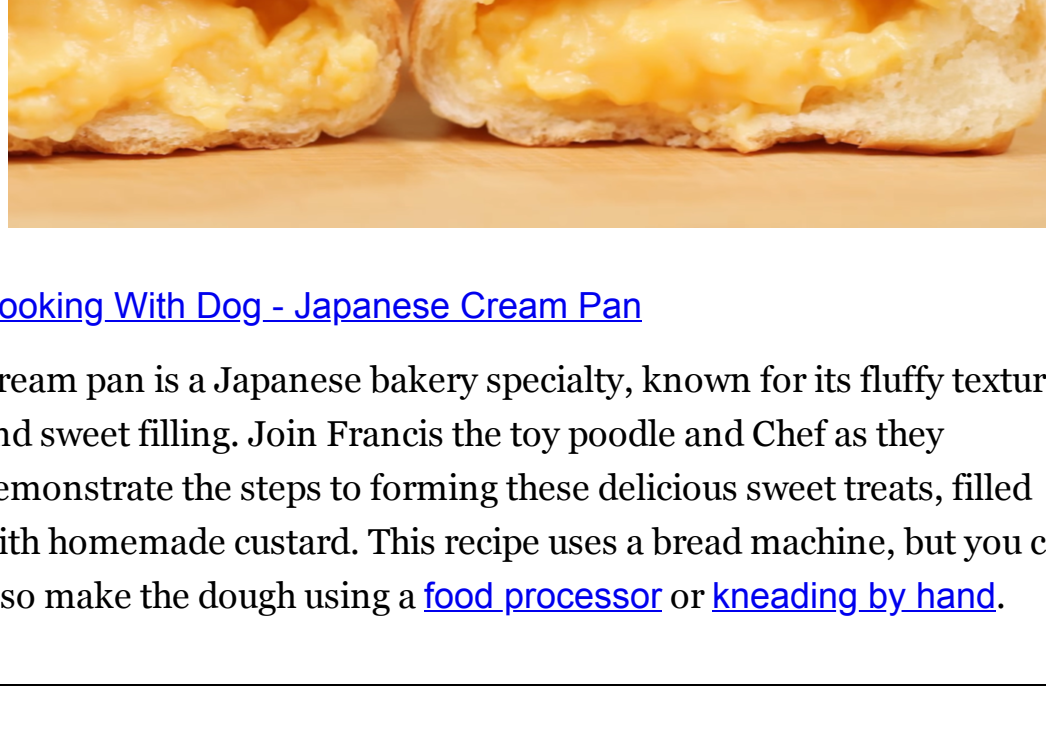

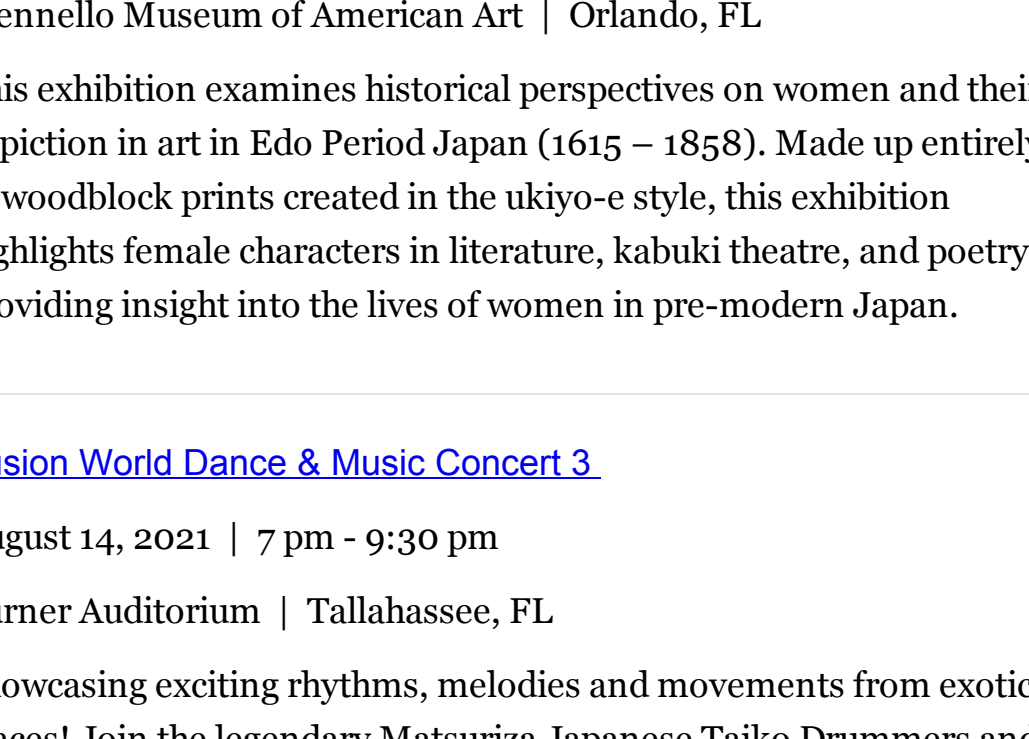
Recipes

Morikami Museum & Japanese Gardens | Delray Beach, FL

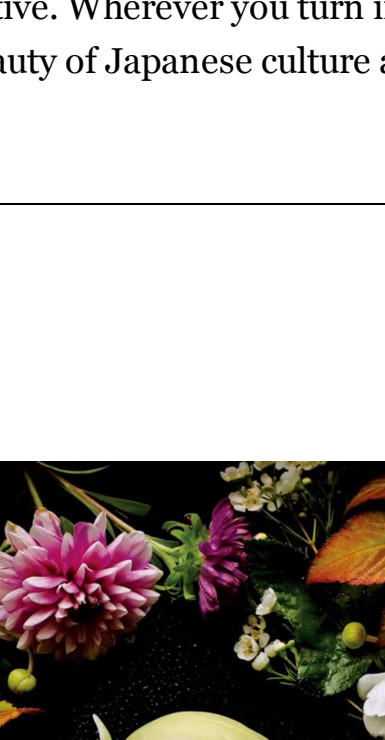

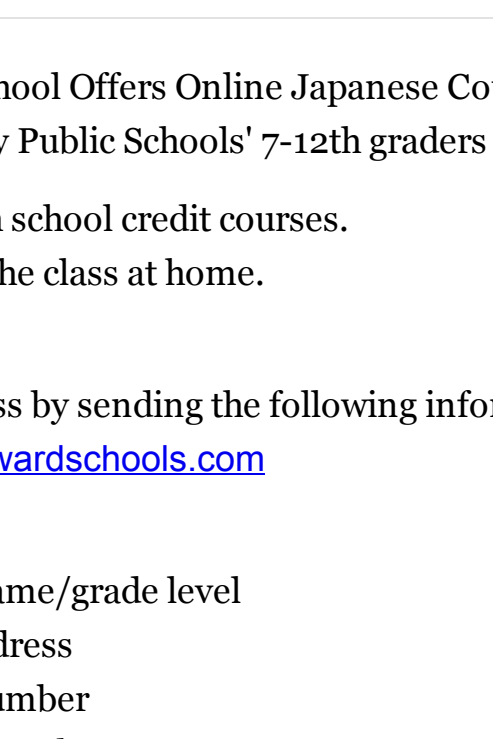


Japan Video Topics

[Wagashi as Performance - From Artisan to Artist \(3:21\)](#)

Wagashi are traditional Japanese sweets, mostly made from rice or bean dough and sweetened with natural ingredients. There are many varieties, but the kind of wagashi called nerikiri is an especially artistic reflection of seasonal themes. Jun-ichi Mitsubori is a wagashi artisan whose unique performances involve crafting extraordinarily beautiful sweets right in front of his audience. Each of his sweets is its own miniature edible work of art!
