Q.1 Do I need to apply for a visa?

If your country is not included in the visa exempted countries, you need to apply for a visa to enter Japan.

Transit visas are issued to foreign nationals (whose country of citizenship is NOT on the <u>visa exemption</u> <u>page</u> traveling through Japan en route to another country and staying for 1 night (or less)only.

Q.2 I am a permanent resident of the U.S, do I need to apply for a visa?

Despite of the fact that you hold permanent residency in the U.S, you need to apply for a visa if **your Nationality** is not included in the visa exemption country list on the <u>visa exemption page</u>.

Q3. When should I start applying for a visa?

You can start applying for a visa 90 days prior to your arrival date in Japan.

Since a visa is valid for 90 days after its issue date, you need to enter Japan with the issued visa within that period.

Q4. Can I walk in to drop off my visa application?

At the moment, we are asking every applicant to make a reservation in advance to visit our office. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

Q5. How can I make an appointment?

Q6. Is there any express service in order to expedite my visa application?

We don't offer any expedited service. Please apply early for a visa, well in advance of the anticipated travel date.

Q7. How can I apply for a multiple entry visa?

Please note that a multiple entry visa might not be issued to you after reviewing your visa application.

If you would like to apply for one, please submit a letter to explain the reasons why you need to apply for a multiple entry visa, provide estimated dates for future travels to Japan, and submit your last six

month's bank statements to prove you have sufficient funds.

Q8. I have a layover in Japan, do I need to apply for a visa?

Usually if you are staying in the airport, and don't need to go through customs or security before changing from one plane to another, you can transit through Japan without a visa.

Please confirm with your airline company regarding your itinerary.

If you would like to go outside the airport for sightseeing or to stay at a hotel, you need to apply for a transit visa.

Please note that you can apply for a transit visa only when you are staying in Japan for less than two days.
